



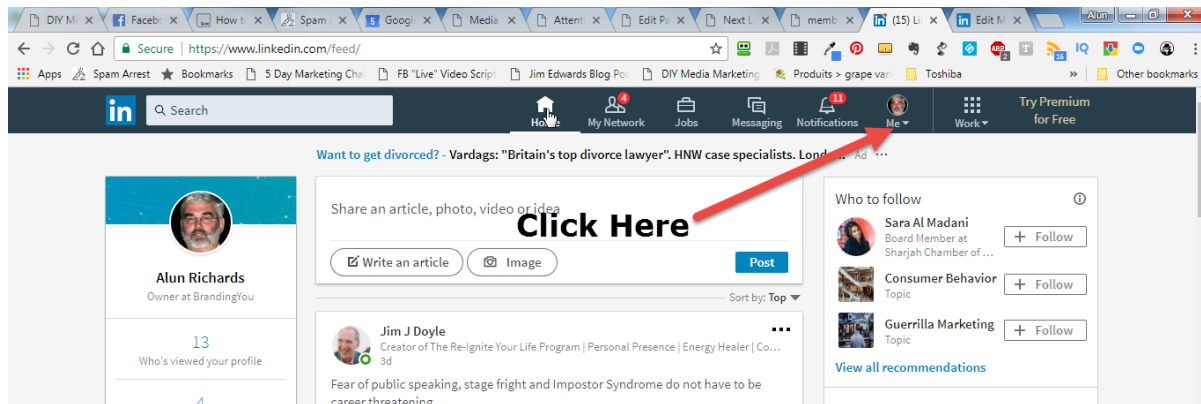

This document shows you how to find your LinkedIn Author Page.

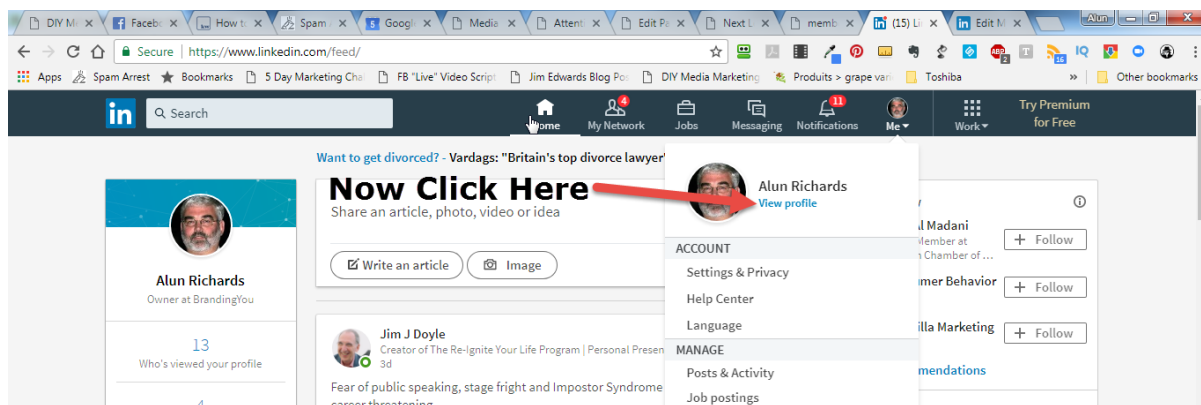
FIND YOUR LINKEDIN AUTHOR PAGE

1. SIGN IN TO LINKEDIN

To see your Profile, click 'Me'.



2. NOW CLICK 'VIEW PROFILE'



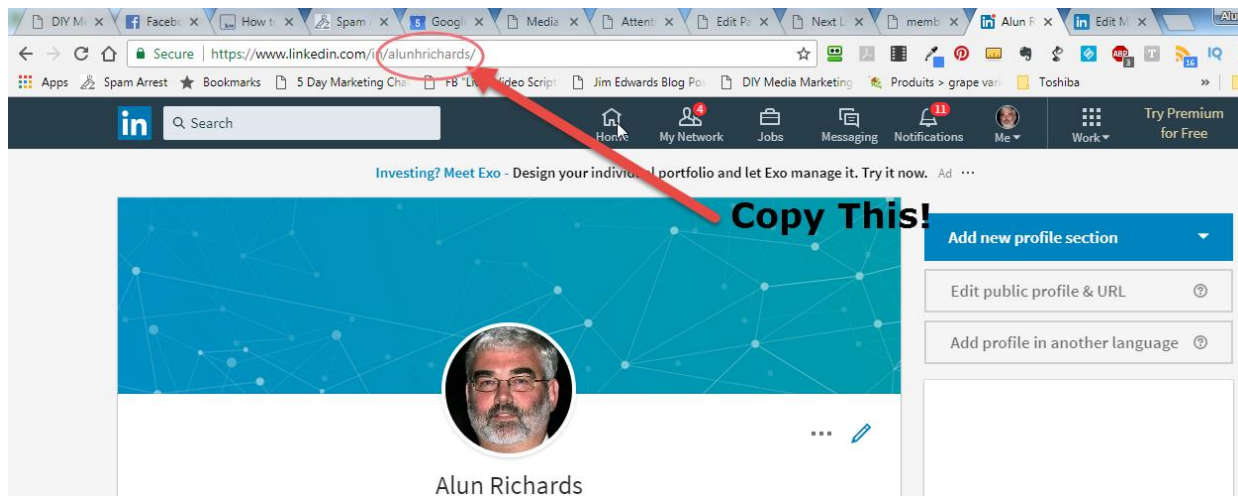
Your LinkedIn Profile will now display (see below).

3. GO TO THE ADDRESS BAR

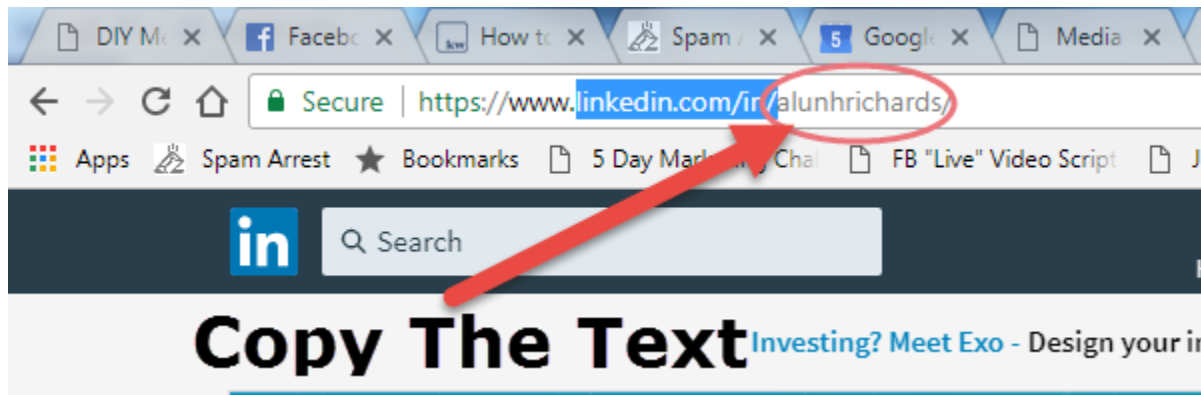
Copy the text **after** linkedin.com/in/

This may be your name, or a version of it. It may be alun-richards-63542-01a

Whatever it is, **copy it**.

4. USE THAT LINK

Now type into the address bar:

linkedin.com/today/author/**thetextyoucopied**

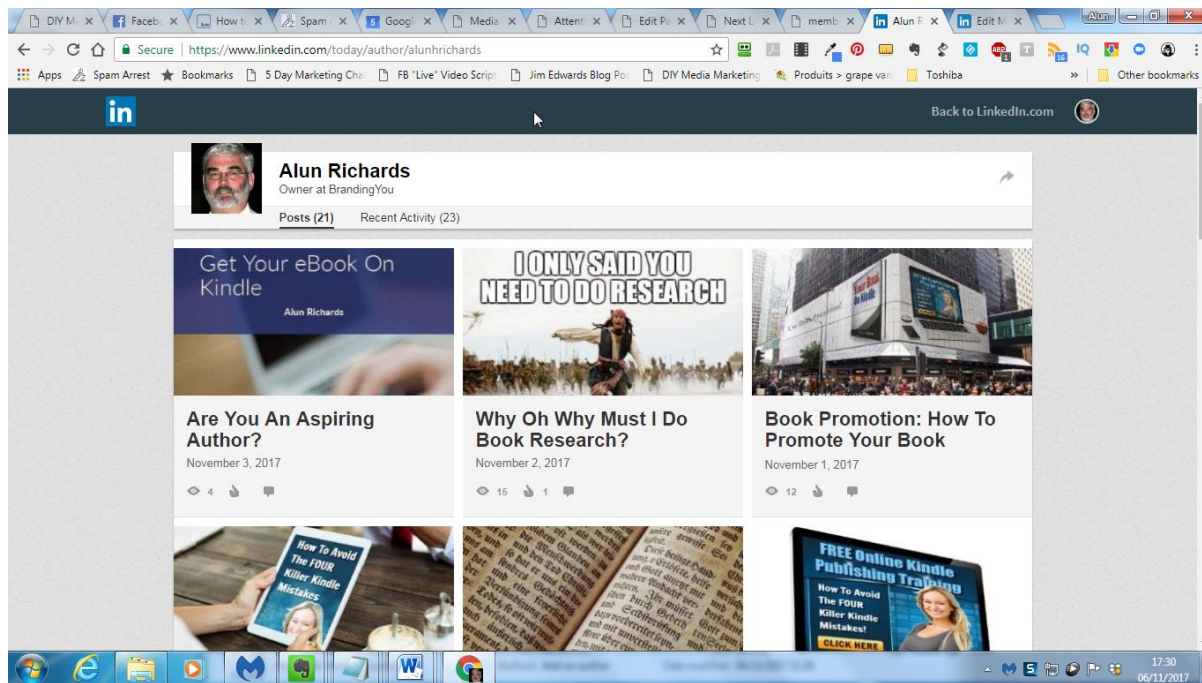
Make sure you don't include the last '/'

It should look like this: linkedin.com/today/author/alunrichards

Where alunrichards is replaced with YOUR TEXT

5. ADMIRE YOUR AUTHOR PAGE

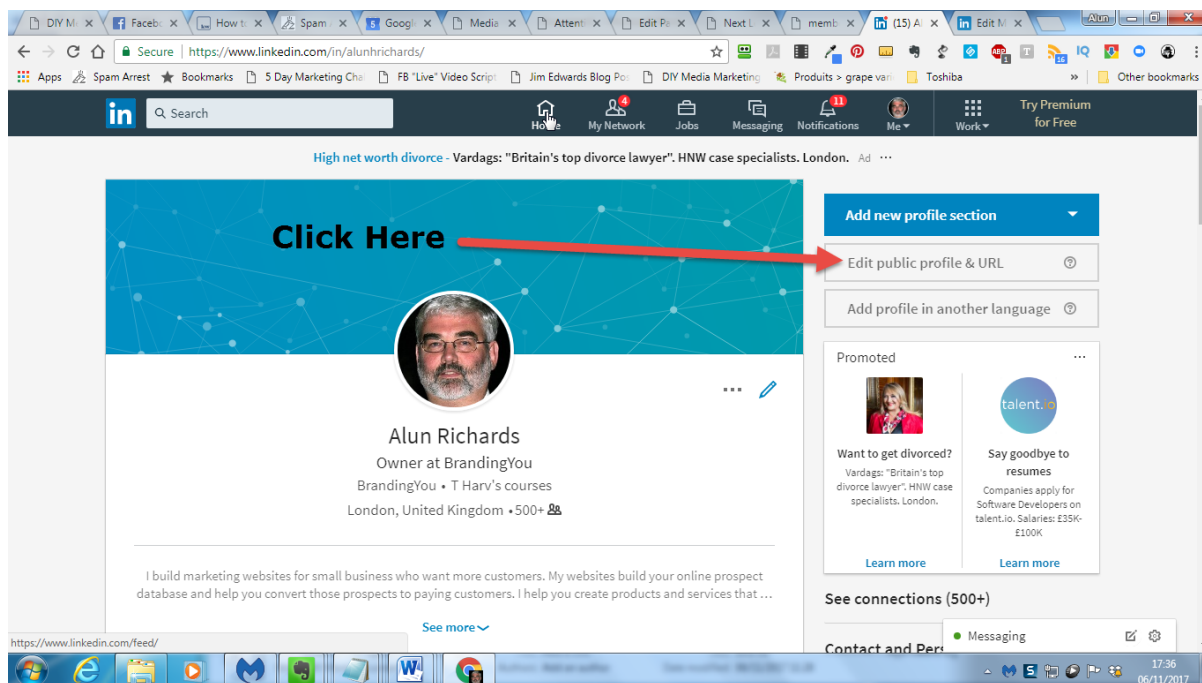
Your LinkedIn Author Page should now display.



This is the URL to which you point your domain (eg articlesbyalun.com)

6. OPTIONAL – EDIT YOUR PROFILE NAME

You can edit your **LinkedIn Profile Name**, which changes your **Author Page URL**.

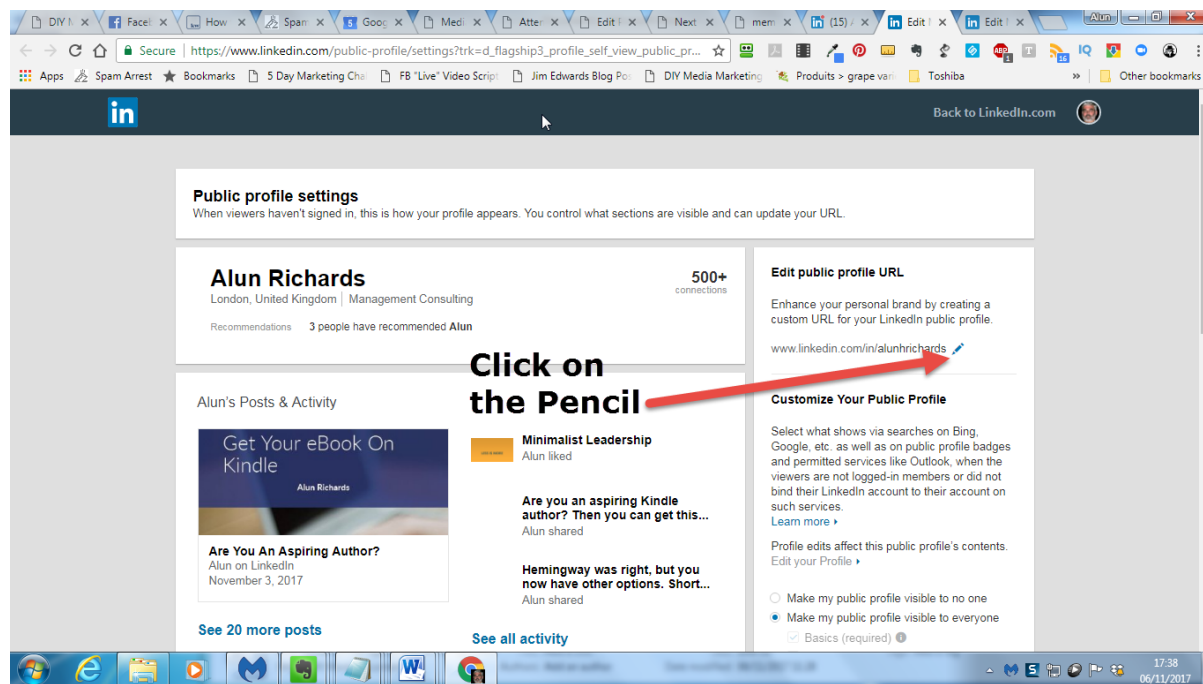


7. CHANGE PUBLIC PROFILE URL

Click on the **Pencil** and you can edit your **Profile URL**. Well, the name part of it, anyway.

The name you use must not already be taken.

So you can get alunhrichards instead of alun-richards-63578-01a, for example.



Note!

If you do change the URL, your **Author Page URL** will change too.

So if you want to change it, do it **before** you redirect your domain.
